Annual Report of the Irish Water Spaniel Association, 1933.

DURING 1933, the policy of the Association has been, as in previous years, to encourage the production of good **looking** Irish Water Spaniels, by supporting Shows, and in every way encouraging the true breed, whilst its **working** qualities have been encouraged by three days Field Trials during the shooting season. The first Field Trial Meeting of the season was at Anley, Settle, on October 2nd and 3rd, where the Association again had the good fortune to be the invited guests of Colonel Birkbeck, and a Novice and Open Stake were run on the two days, with, as usual, a super-abundance of game—wild duck, pheasant, grouse, partridge, woodcock, snipe and ground game, and in fine weather on those glorious moors two most enjoyable days were spent.

The Association is indeed deeply indebted to their host and hostess, on this and so many other occasions, for their never-ending hospitality, and the historian of the future cannot fail to record the great benefit the breed is undoubtedly deriving from these Field Trials.

Captain Metcalf and Mr. Alan Greenwell kindly acted as Judges, and Captain Bolton as Referee, the Field Stewards being Major B. D. Court-Treatt and Captain Austin, while the management of the various beats by Mr. G. Robbins left nothing to be desired.

The second Field Trial Meeting was at Helperby, where the Association spent a most enjoyable day on the 8th January, 1934, being the guests of Sir Clive Coats, Bart. One Open Stake was run and a quantity of game of all kinds available; the Judges had no difficulty in making their decisions. The water test was in the River Swale, which being in full flood afforded quite a strenuous trial. Mr. J. Bell and Captain Stevens kindly acted as Judges, and Captain Hutton Croft refereed.

The Association is much indebted to Mr. H. H. Hughes for the excellent arrangements made for these Trials and so ably carried out by Mr. S. Witt and Mr. C. Topham, the "Steward of the Beats." All present at the Trials were sumptuously entertained to luncheon by Sir Clive and Lady Coates in a large marquee erected on the ground.

The winner of the Open Stake and the Association's Field Trial Challenge Cup, at Settle, was Sir Clive Coate's "Qui Hi of Helperby," and his owner, and also his trainer and handler, Mr. Topham, is to be congratulated on winning later on in the season the Stake at the Spaniel Club's Trials for any variety—except Cockers and Springers. The other Stake containing 12 entries at Helperby was won by "Ratie of Helperby." We should all like to see this now famous Field Trial Kennel more often represented at Shows.

This year, 1934, is the centenary of the birth of Mr. Justice McCarthy's famous dog, "Boatswain," the great pillar of the Stud Book in this breed, who was born in 1834. Although entries in this breed at the Kennel Club during the year have not been so numerous as we could wish, from information as to breeding operations being projected, I do not think there need be any pessimism thereat, but it would certainly be a great advantage if members would register more dogs and support shows with more entries.

During the past year the breed was foremost in several competitions open to **any** variety, and a specimen of this breed won the Junior International Class (**all breeds**) at Cruft's Show. In France Mons. Naegely's kennel reigns supreme, and the breed is making headway in Holland and Italy, while America and Canada are always seeking good specimens.

The next Field Trial Meeting will be at Settle on October 1st and 2nd, where the Club once more will be the guest of Colonel Birkbeck, and later on Sir Clive Coates has very kindly extended an invitation for January 7th, 1935.

Members should endeavour to induce new members to join the Association, and breed many more Irish Spaniels, so that they become more numerous and better known.

Members may obtain the Association's silver badge, in the form of a brooch, at a moderate cost, by applying to the Hon. Secretary.

Copies of the Rules of the Association, and the Breeders' Cups, as well as the scale of points and description of the Irish Water Spaniel, can be obtained at any time by applying to the Hon. Secretary. It is the earnest desire of the Committee to further the interests of the breed in every way, and suggestions, ideas and criticisms are invited.

DESCRIPTIVE PARTICULARS.

HEAD.—Skull and muzzle should be of good size; skull high in dome, good length, and fairly wide, showing large brain capacity; muzzle long, strong, and somewhat square in appearance; *face perfectly smooth*. Topknot should consist of long, loose curls, growing down into a well-defined peak between the eyes, and should not be in the form of a wig, *i.e.* growing straight across.

EYES.—Comparatively small *dark brown and very intelligent-looking*.

EARS.—Very long and lobe-shaped in the leather, set low, hanging quite close to the cheeks, and covered with long, twisted curls of live hair.

NECK.—Fairly long, strong, and arching (carrying the head *well above the level of the back*), and strongly set into the shoulders.

BODY (including size and symmetry)—Fair sized, round and barrel shaped; so stout and compact-like as to convey a "cobiness" in appearance. Height—Dogs about 21 to 23 inches at shoulder; bitches about 20 to 22 ins.

NOSE.—Large and well developed, and of a dark liver colour.

SHOULDERS AND CHEST.—Shoulders very powerful, but *not* too straight or "cloddy"; chest deep, but not too wide or round between the fore-legs, though large in girth, with ribs well-sprung behind the shoulders.

BACK AND LOINS.—Back, short, broad, level, and very powerfully coupled to hind quarters. Ribs carried well back, and loins deep and wide.

HIND QUARTERS.—Very powerful, with long, *well-bent stifles, and hocks set low*.

STERN.—Short and smooth, strong and thick at root (where it is covered for three or four inches with short curls), and, gradually tapering, ends in a fine point. It should not be long enough to reach the hock joint, and should be carried nearly level with the back in a straight line.

FEET AND LEGS.—Feet large, somewhat *round and spreading*, well-clothed with hair, both over and between the toes, but free from any superfluous feather. Fore-legs, well-boned and straight, with *arms well let down*, and carrying the forearm at elbow and knee, in a straight line with point of shoulder.

COAT.—Composed of dense, tight, crisp, ringlets, entirely free from woolliness; the fore-legs covered with feather, which should be abundant all round, though shorter in front, so as only to give a rough appearance; *below the hocks the hind-legs must be smooth in front, but feathered behind down to the feet*.

COLOUR.—*A very rich puce liver*, white on chest objectionable.

GENERAL APPEARANCE.—That of a *smart, up-standing strongly built*, but not leggy dog, combining great intelligence and endurance, with a *bold and dashing* eagerness of temperament, and a characteristic gait, distinctive of the breed which is a different movement to that of any other variety of Spaniel.

RULES AND REGULATIONS
OF THE
Irish Water Spaniel Association.

Name and Objects of the Association.

I.—The Club shall be called the IRISH WATER SPANIEL ASSOCIATION. Its objects shall be—(a) To promote the breeding of pure Irish Water Spaniels; (b) To define precisely and publish a description of the true type, and to urge the adoption of such type on breeders, judges, &c., as the only recognised and unvarying standard by which Irish Water Spaniels shall be judged; (c) To do all in its power to protect and advance the interests of the breed, by offering prizes at Dog Shows, establishing Field Trials, and adopting such other means as may be deemed advisable.

Establishment and Constitution.

II.—The Club shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer, and a Committee of not more than twelve (including the Hon. Secretary and Treasurer) and an unlimited number of Members whose names and addresses shall be kept in a book by the Hon. Secretary. Not less than three members to form a quorum.

Subscription.

III.—The Annual Subscription shall be *One Guinea*, due on 1st January each year (or within one week after election), and there shall be no entrance fee. No one shall be entitled to the privileges of membership or to win any special prizes offered by the Club until his Annual Subscription shall have been paid. The liability of a Member shall not exceed his Annual Subscription. That any Member failing to pay his Subscription by 1st February shall be reminded of the omission by the Hon. Secretary, and should it remain unpaid by 1st March it shall be within the power of the Committee to erase his name from the list of Members.

Election of Members.

IV.—Candidates for Membership must be proposed by a Member of the Club, and elected by the Committee by voting papers, and one negative in five votes to exclude. On the admission of each new member, the Secretary shall send a notification to that effect, and furnish him with a copy of the Rules.

Management.

V.—The management of, and the property of the Club shall be vested in the Committee. The Committee shall also have the power of making Byelaws, and deciding upon all matters in dispute, or not provided for by the Rules. The name of any Member or Members put forward for election on the Committee must be sent with their Proposer's and Secunder's names to the Hon. Secretary prior to the 30th November in each year. The existing Committee, together with the *New* Candidates, to be submitted to each Member of the Club for election. In the event of there being no such Candidate, the Committee to remain in office. The voting papers to be returned to the Hon. Secretary, with votes recorded, on or before a fixed date. Three to form a quorum at Committee Meetings.

Meetings.

VI.—That General Meetings of the Club shall be held from time to time, at such places as the Committee may think desirable.

Method of Conducting Business.

VII.—That, inasmuch as it is scarcely possible for the Committee to meet more than once or twice a year, it shall be competent for the Hon. Secretary to transact all such business as might be done at a Meeting of the Committee by letter. At every Meeting, whether General or of the Committee, the Minutes of the last previous Meeting shall be read over and confirmed before any other business is gone into. At least seven days' notice shall be sent of every Meeting, and with the notice shall be stated a list of the business to be transacted and copies of all the proposed resolutions. No business which is

not contained in this list, other than matters of routine, shall be gone into at any Meeting whether General or of the Committee. Each Member shall be entitled, in the event of his being unable to attend the Meeting, to vote on any resolution by returning his notice paper to the Hon. Secretary two clear days before the Meeting, sealed and addressed to the Chairman, marked "for" or "against," or nominating any Member who may be present as his proxy to vote for him, and such voting shall rank as equal with the votes of those present. Every paper used in this way, however, must be signed by the Member so using it, and if unsigned, must be rejected. At General Meetings two Scrutineers shall be appointed, whose business it shall be to open the voting papers, and record the votes. The President of the Club, if present, shall preside at every Meeting; in his absence the Vice-President shall take his place, and in their absence the Members shall elect a Chairman, who shall have a casting vote in the event of a tie taking place, and whose ruling on any point shall be binding on the Meeting.

Expenses, Report, &c.

VIII.—That no expense be incurred by the Hon. Secretary or Treasurer, or by any Member of the Committee, beyond the funds in hand. That an Annual Report, together with the Rules of the Club, the names and addresses of the Members, Committee, Officers, &c., shall be printed and supplied to all Members; and that the Annual Abstract of Accounts (duly audited by two Members elected at a General Meeting) shall be open to the inspection of Members.

Eligibility.

IX.—That all dogs competing for Irish Water Spaniel Association's Prizes must be entered according to the *latest* Revised Rules of the Kennel Club.

Prizes.

X.—That the Challenge Cup presented to the Association by Colonel Millner and Mr. E. White, entitled "The Irish Water Spaniel Association's Perpetual Challenge Cup," be offered by the Club, for competition by members only, as may be decided by the Committee. The Challenge Cup presented

to the Association by its President, Viscount de Vesci, entitled "The Irish Water Spaniel Association's Field Trial Challenge Cup," be offered for competition by Members only, at *one* Field Trial in each season, as may be decided by the Committee. A small replica Cup to be given to the winner, whose name shall also be engraved on the Challenge Cups.

That no Association Specials or Cups will be awarded at any Show where there are not *two* eligible to compete for same and each dog or bitch must have won *at least* a third prize in their class. No dog shall be awarded an Association's Special Prize at Field Trials that has not obtained *at least* a Certificate of Merit at the Trials.

Expulsion of a Member—New Kennel Club Rule.

XI. Any member who shall be suspended by the Kennel Club shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Club and if the conduct of any member shall, in the opinion of the Committee, be injurious, or likely to be injurious, to the character or interests of the Club the Committee may at a meeting, the notice convening which includes as an object the consideration of the conduct of the member, determine that a Special General Meeting of the Club shall be called for the purpose of passing a resolution to expel him. Notices of both meetings shall be sent to the accused member advising him of the place, date and hour, and that he may attend and offer an explanation. If at the Special General Meeting a resolution to expel is passed by a two-thirds majority of the members present and voting, his name shall be forthwith erased from the List of Members, and he shall thereupon cease for all purposes to be a member of the Club, except that he may within two calendar months appeal to the Kennel Club upon and subject to such conditions as the Kennel Club may impose.

Alterations.

XII.—That each member of this Association agrees to acknowledge the Kennel Club as the final Court of Appeal in all matters of dispute.

XIII.—That none of the foregoing Rules be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Club convened for the purpose.

The Irish Water Spaniel Association's Breeders' Cups Rules.

I.—The Cups to be called the Irish Water Spaniel Breeders' Cups and Sweepstakes, and to be of not less value than £5 each, open to all members of the Irish Water Spaniel Association on payment of £1, *i.e.*, 10/- to each Cup, to be competed for by Irish Water Spaniels, bred and owned by the same Exhibitor. Any member may subscribe and compete for each Cup separately, or both as he may desire.

II.—The Cups to be one for either sex, and cannot be won more than *three* times by the same dog or bitch; either shall become the property of the first Exhibitor who wins it seven times.

III.—After the first fee of £1 (or 10/- to one Cup), no additional entry fee will be necessary, until one of the Cups has been finally won, when a 10/- subscription will be asked for to replace it.

IV.—All money over the cost of the Cup to be given as added money (or Sweepstake) to the winner, less expenses of postage, etc., paid out.

V.—The Cup Competitions shall be managed by the Committee of the Club. Members may enter as long as the Cup is for competition, and may compete with an unlimited number of dogs.

VI.—The Cup shall be offered as often as the majority of the Committee may elect, at any Show under the K.C. Rules.

VII.—The winner shall have his name and dog's name engraved on the Cup. No one shall be allowed to compete who has not paid his entry fee.

VIII.—The Cups will not be awarded at any Show where there are not *two* eligible to compete for same, and each dog or bitch must have won *at least* a Third Prize in their Class.

Training Irish Water Spaniels as Gun Dogs.

At a General Meeting of the Irish Water Spaniel Association in February, 1928, the following suggestions were formulated for the guidance of trainers and handlers of these dogs at Field Trials, etc.

- (i.) Absolute steadiness to shot, feather and fur in any circumstances.
- (ii.) " Dropping " (which includes " sitting " or " standing ") when commanded to do so, and remaining so until directed otherwise.
- (iii.) May be required to beat out any rushy, swampy place, or other covert that a Retriever would ordinarily be expected to face, as the Judges may require.
- (iv.) No artificial means may be used to induce a dog to enter water apart from the sanctions of legitimate handling (e.g., no stones, sticks, or such like, may be thrown in).
- (v.) These dogs should work, largely, to " hand-signals," as silence, and the absence, as far as possible, of whistling and noise, on the part of the handler, is essential.

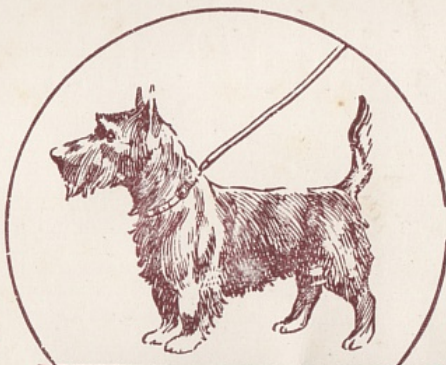

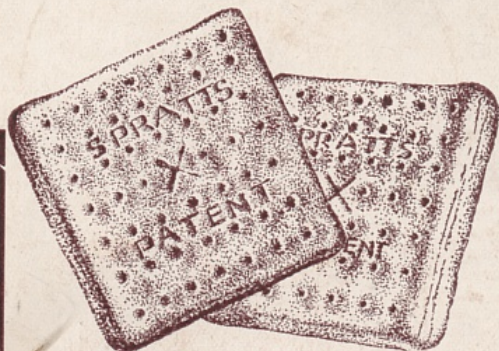
